artistic authenticity and validates ability across all creative fields. The theme of this year's ARTS Experience was "Planting Seeds"; members of Ontario ARC's art, horticulture, and music program took part in cultivating creative relationships at several community events.

An original, humorous, modern adaptation of Jack and the Beanstalk was debuted by members of the music program. They call their theatrical styling a "sound choir," in which sound effects, acting, musical instruments, and body-language performance accompany a beat-driven narration and encourages audience participation. The hugely successful showing signals a likely encore performance, says Nathan Merrill, Music Specialist.

Members of the Horticulture program created an interactive, hands-on workshop

experience, where soil, clay, and seeds were mixed together to make "seed bombs." The activity inspired gardeners, gift-givers, flower-lovers, and ecology enthusiasts to share their excitement about beautifying their communities.

Ontario ARC artists submitted their work for exhibition in the Gala Art Show and also created the Ontario ARC annual ARTS Festival banner, which was prominently displayed behind the live band at the Gala.

The entire Ontario ARC Creative Expressions team was part of the Gala's production, with help from College Experience students.

SELF-ADVOCACY GROUP EXPANDS REACH

The Self-Advocacy group of Ontario ARC is expanding its reach. The open-door group includes people with disabilities or other challenges and works to raise awareness, break down stereotypes, and promote acceptance and respect.

LEANNE STRONG, A FOREVER LEARNER

Leanne Strong, a 2015 graduate of Project SEARCH, was recently published in the March 31st issue of Autism Parenting Magazine. Leanne's article, "In My Words: Why It's Important to Teach the True Definition of Fairness," explains the value of teaching to children with autism the difference between fair and equal.

Writing for a national magazine is just one of the major endeavors that Leanne has pursued this past spring; she has also been accepted at The College of Saint Rose College Experience, a two-year residential non-credit certificate program. Leanne moves to the Albany campus this fall.

"Leanne is a 'forever learner," says Lisa Bugbee, who works with Leanne as a broker through Self-Direction. "Nothing is on the backburner for her and she is open to any experience where she learns a new skill or has some kind of takeaway that she uses to move her life forward." As a broker, Lisa responds to Leanne's plans and works to make sure that her budget is adjusted to represent her goals. Focusing on community outreach, the group is growing its connections with regional, state, national, and international self-advocacy forums. Their collaborative efforts focus on speaking for themselves and contributing to decisions in dialogues on their needs and rights in the community, at jobs, and in managing their support systems.

The Self-Advocacy group recently produced and starred in a Statement of Rights video due to be released this fall at a 'Hollywood-style' premier party. This unique Statement of Rights centers on the right to design one's own life, and includes the right to work in one's own community, right to freedom from abuse, and right to privacy.

The video and an accompanying pamphlet is an exciting, innovative curriculum that will educate people on person-centered planning and the needs and goals of people with disabilities—all from the perspective of Self-Advocacy group members.

The Self-Advocacy group also plans to march in the Canandaigua July 4th parade, wearing t-shirts promoting their message "Spread the Word to End the Word: Respect is the new R Word."
