This is an exciting opportunity for our Pet Connections volunteers and a wonderful achievement of the animal-assisted interventions program! Once volunteers and their dogs meet the required number of volunteer hours and visits to qualify, they can then apply for one of five AKC therapy dog titles, with certification provided by Pet Connections. Earning AKC recognition shows our community that Ontario ARC and Pet Connections are as dedicated to our volunteers (including furry ones!) as we are to the people we support.

MARKEZAH PHILLIP-HOLBROOK,

a graduate of the College Experience program at Hobart and William Smith Colleges, is now working at the Vanity Fair clothing store located at Waterloo Premium Outlets. Markezah interned at the store during her last year with the College Experience and was hired soon after graduation—a perfect match for someone who loves fashion!

BEN GREEN, a graduate of the College Experience program at Finger Lakes Community College, became employed by AVI Foodsystems in the FLCC cafeteria prior to graduation. Another great example of how internships can result in a job offer.

ANNE GLEASON, a graduate of the College Experience program at Finger Lakes Community College, is working at North Star Coffee, a division of Ontario ARC, in Canandaigua. Her experiences helped her gain the confidence to move beyond the familiar and begin to explore career possibilities.

Ontario ARC's College Experience is an innovative pre-employment program for posthigh school adults, with locations at Finger Lakes Community College and Hobart and William Smith Colleges (HWS). Thirty five students have graduated from the program since the first class in 2007.

One highlight of the program is the range of internship opportunities, says Mary Kelly, Associate Professor of Education at Hobart and William Smith Colleges. Students explore different vocations at local businesses, schools, and organizations to identify potential career paths and job opportunities. Job placement is 80 percent with many of those jobs being the result of successful internships.

Graduates of Ontario ARC's College Experience program have gone on to jobs that support their independent lives as part of their chosen communities. One of those success stories is Darrius Lauster who balances multiple jobs, including one at Bubble Tea in Geneva. Darius has moved on from the College Experience program and is successful in the workforce. He has not forgotten his 'alma mater' and the experience he had there. The "tip" jar at Bubble Tea is designated for charitable giving and each month employees can pass the donations on to local charities. Darius has chosen to give back to the HWS College Experience program twice.

"The Ontario ARC College Experience Program at HWS provides an invaluable opportunity to gain vocational and adult living skills in a college environment," says Kelly. "Students participate in internships, audit classes, enjoy student activities and clubs, and walk across the stage at graduation."

Like Anne, Ben, and Markezah, their walk across the stage is the first step toward the start of their careers and living independently in the community of their choice. \checkmark

THE POWER OF SIMPLE ACTS

Earlier this year, Audrey Dye, Work and Life Skills Instructor, was working with members of Ontario ARC's JET Connections preemployment program, delivering Meals On Wheels to local community members. During one routine stop, the meal delivery crew encountered a client who took longer than usual to answer the door. The gentleman was not his usual smiling and engaging self. The crew reported their findings to the Ontario County Office for the Aging safety line.

Upon returning a few weeks later, he was back greeting them with a smile. The gentleman had suffered a stroke and was hospitalized, but made a quick recovery. He was happy to be able to thank Audrey and the meal delivery crew for their simple act that saved his life. For the crew involved, this experience added another benefit to the JET mission of learning work readiness and social skills: feeling valued for a simple act that goes beyond the job at-hand.
