Lucie, who is 80 years old and lives with short term memory loss due to vascular dementia, started attending Silver Connections this past summer. Colleen, Lucie's primary caregiver, works during the day and finds comfort knowing Lucie is being cared for in a safe and stimulating environment. Enriching social programs like Silver Connections are a growing need for families, says Michelle Jungermann, director of meaningful activities at Ontario ARC. Colleen calls the program a godsend for families with aging relatives who need support during the day.

Spending four hours daily Monday through Friday in the Silver Connections program gives Lucie companionship, a sense of security, enriching activities, and the types of connections with people that keep her laughing. The program's location in the Eberhardt Center provides access "I know they care about my mother and I'm always happy knowing she's going to be happy when I drop her off for the day."

to the therapy pool, art and music rooms, greenhouse, kitchen, sensory garden, and sensory relaxation room.

Lucie's days are a mixture of self-directed activities and engaging with staff members. She paints, something Colleen says her mother has always enjoyed, and loves socializing with "the girls." Colleen praises the staff for how quickly they learned about her mother preferences, including music and favorite colors. Lucie's favorite activities are Tuesday car rides and just enjoying the views from the large windows at Eberhardt Center.

Bad Dog[™] Boutique, a social enterprise of Ontario ARC, opened their storefront in November 2018 and since then has built a loyal following of customers for grooming and pet products, including gifts, supplies, and Bad Dog[™]-branded treats, toys, and pet care.

All members of the boutique's staff have been working together to expand the product selection, including items for feline friends added by popular request, and Bad Dog's own line of signature t-shirts for the people in dogs' lives. The boutique has also become the area's go-to for self-service dog washing.

Summer foot traffic, hosting 500+ visitors with partner Tabora Farm & Winery during the Canandaigua Wine Walk, and the boutique's seasonally-decorated window display on Main Street have driven sales. But it is the personal touch of the staff that has made Bad Dog Boutique a part of the Canandaigua community. Four part-time retail and grooming assistants keep the customers (both furry and human) well-attended and the store stocked and tidy. MACO BAG A REGIONAL LEADER IN INCLUSIVE HIRING & TRAINING

One year ago, Maco Bag, a longtime partner with Ontario ARC's Employment Services program, celebrated 30 years in partnership with Ontario ARC. Since then, the company has piloted a successful model of hiring people for flexible part-time shifts with a critical piece: transportation with the pre-employment group. Doug Kirchhoff, Director of Operations at Maco Bag Corporation and a member of the Ontario ARC Community Advisory Board, calls the success of the program a win-win for the company and the employees who helped pilot this successful model.

So successful that not only does Maco Bag plan to add three more individuals in part-time positions, other local businesses are taking notice and showing interest in duplicating the program to add direct-hire placements in partnership with Ontario ARC.

"The work of the individuals we've hired in partnership with Ontario ARC's Employment Services program allows our company the operational flexibility to pursue growth opportunities," says Mr. Kirchhoff. "It has been a great fit that highlights the best aspect of the Ontario ARC-Maco Bag relationship: connecting with people."
