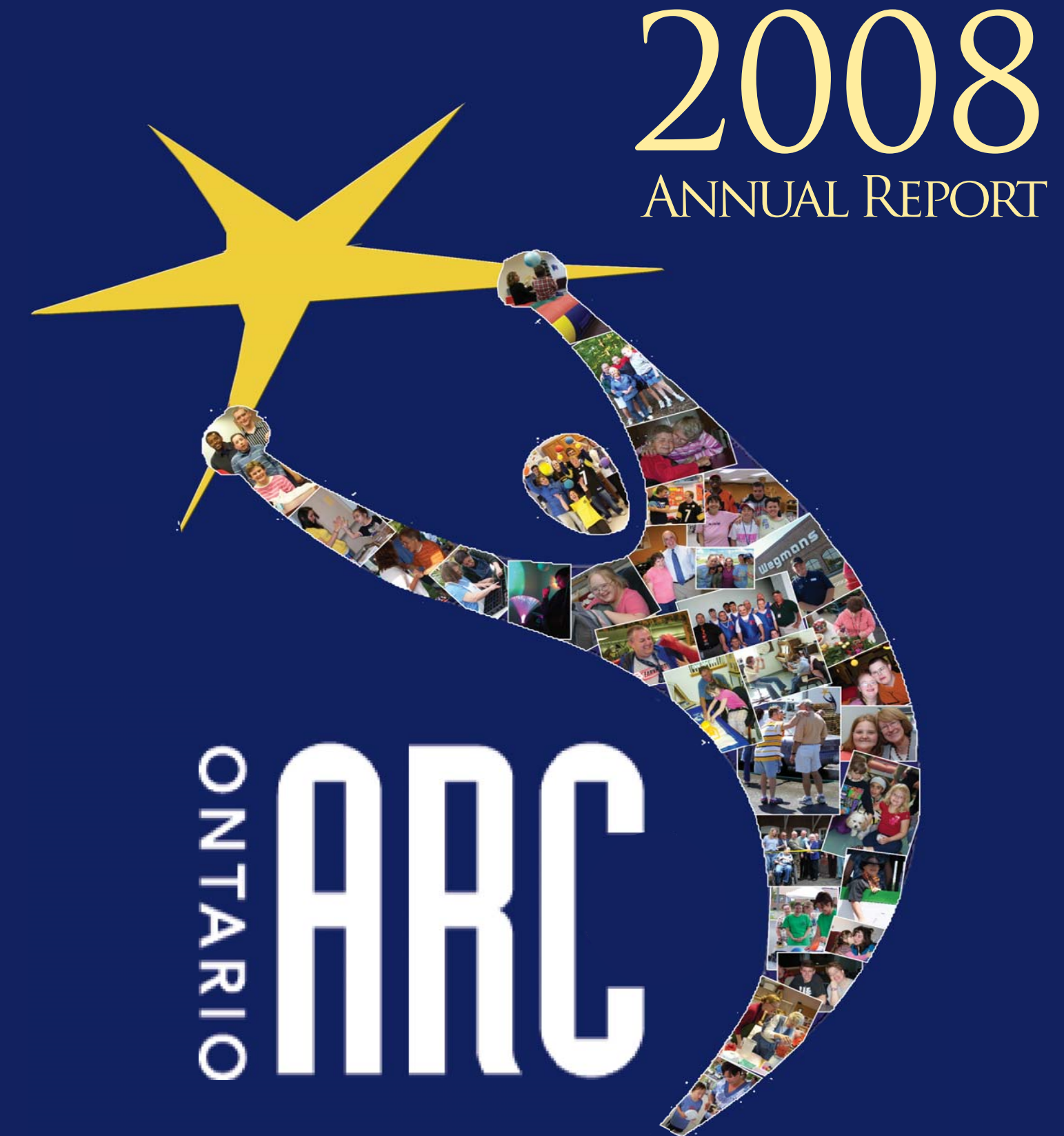
gether through strong advocacy and commitment to our values, we can weather the current crisis and continue to offer first class services to people with developmental disabilities and their families.
